Matangi 1914 - 1918

Matangi 100 Years ago was a growing rural settlement around the newly amalgamated (1917) cooperative Dairy Factory, the railway station, Primary School, Post Office, General Store, blacksmith etc.

By 1918 the huge project of building the 'Glaxo' building and Factory houses was underway with a YMCA hostel set up to help house some of the men required to do the work. Such a project was unusual because of the war.

At the outbreak of war "hundreds of men rode in small groups from the outlying rural areas, including Kawhia, Oparau, Taneatua, Te Mata, Waerenga, Gordonton, Maungatautari, Waotu, Matangi, Waingaro, Waitomo and Te Akau. Eventually they arrived at Hamilton, where they mixed with urban-based men from Hamilton and nearby towns"

"Between 1914 and 1918, Waikato families and communities farewelled more than 5000 men as they headed to war."

He completed his education at the Auckland Grammar School and was afterwards on the staffs of the Auckland Star and Stratford Post. Immediately prior to his enlistment he was managing his mother's farm.

CORPORAL T. W. PHILLIPS. Corporal Thomas Wallace Phillips, recently reported to have died at Walton Hospital, London, through wounds received at the Dardanelles, followed by pneumonia, was well known in the Cambridge district. He was born in Dumbarton, Scotland, in 1894, and came out to the Dominion a few years ago. He served as a volunteer in the Cambridge section of the Waikato Mounted Rifles. Corporal Phillips was a good rifle shot, having won many prizes. [New Zealand Herald, 2 November 1915]

– Corporal James Watson, of Pukerimu, Cambridge, wrote home: "The fighting last night was terrific, the Turks were up on top of the slope and we were half way up so all they had to do was to roll the bombs down on us. Practically all the Auckland Mounted Rifles were killed or wounded. The fourth [Waikato Squadron] had about 16 left out of 89. All the officers killed. Tom Phillips [died of his wounds in England on October 18, 1915] was wounded by one of our naval shells falling short."

AT THE DARDANELLES SOLDIERS' LETTERS.

Writing from Cairo, June 6th,

Private R. M. Sutherland, 16th Waikatos, relates some of his experiences in the landing at the Dardanelles. Private Sutherland, with Privates H. Bell, T. Holloway and **Alf. Ticklepenny** [sic], were employed at the Matangi milk factory, when war broke out, and immediately they all enlisted. "The Waikatos were the first New Zealanders into the firing line...I can tell you things were pretty warm. The bullets and shells were very thick. It was not long before dead and wounded were lying all over the beach, but somehow it seemed natural to see them there...I never heard what happened to **Alf**; he seems to have been missed after the first day. [*Waikato Times*, 16 July 1915]
